---

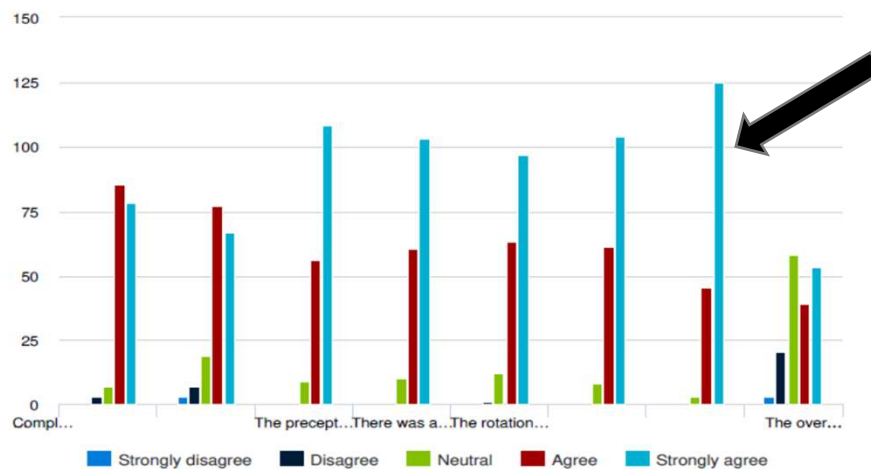
- The CRC continues to enhance the tools available for AAAAI members to use with learners in their office/clinic

# Fast Facts from end of use evaluation of the curriculum by recent CRC users

---

- From January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 to December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021, **1,080** people registered for the curriculum
  - This includes both students/resident, few faculty members, other learners
- There were 695 residents who participated in the curriculum
  - ~50 FM
  - ~150 Medicine
  - ~ 40 Med/Peds
  - ~ 320 Peds
  - Ophthalmology, Dermatology, ENT, PM&R, Radiology
- There were 338 medical students who participated in the course

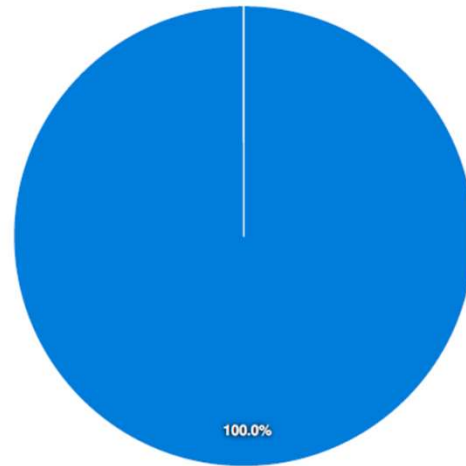

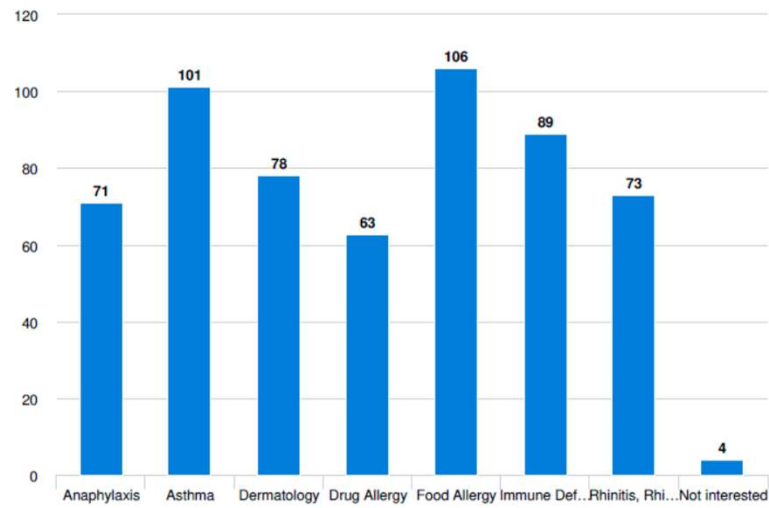

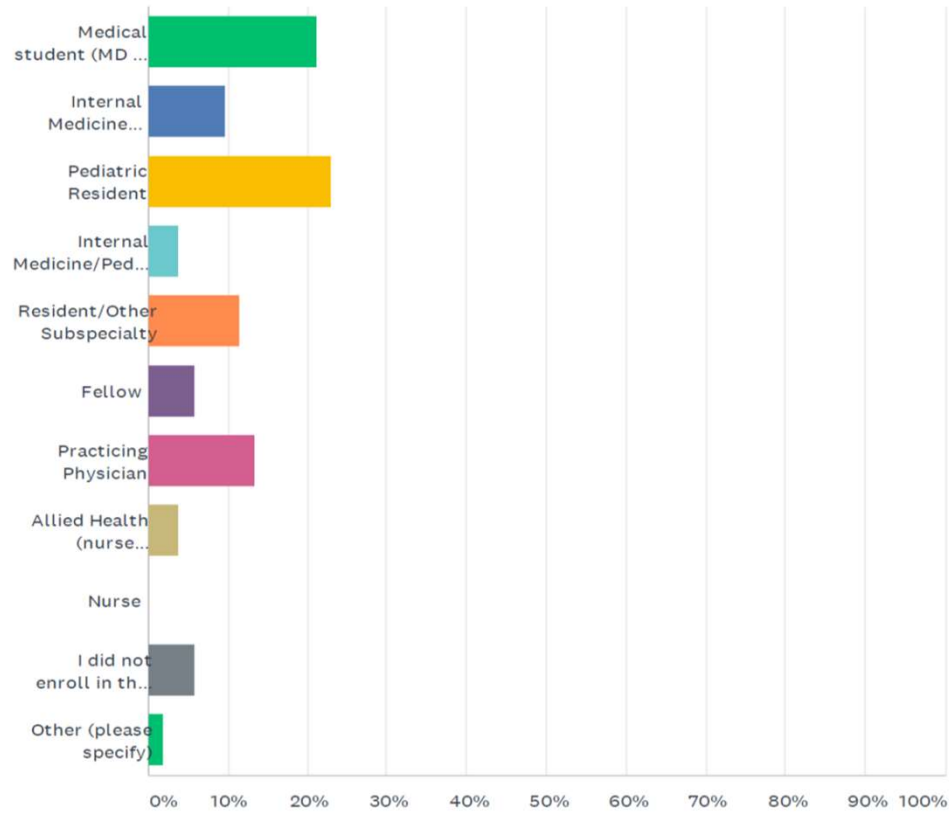
# Survey of CRC past users—2018-2021

---

- Survey was sent to learners who used the curriculum from 2018-2021
  - A total of 52 responses were received from a sample size of 1,839 for a response rate of 3%
    - There are likely multiple reasons for the poor response: no longer using the curriculum, time/effort needed to fill out the survey, change in email address (many learners moved on from the program that they were in when using the curriculum)
    - The majority who responded were students/residents when using the curriculum
    - The majority of respondents were residents/fellows

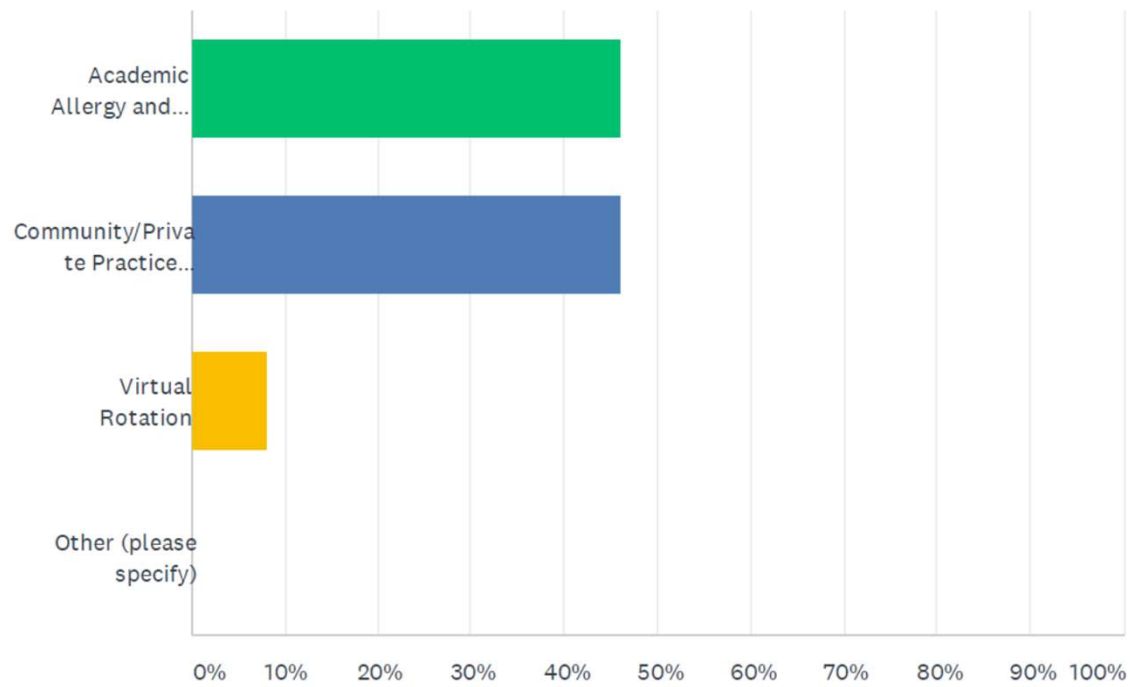
# Q1 What was your level of training when you enrolled in the AAAAI Clinical Rotation Curriculum?

## Q2 In what context did you enroll in the AAAAI Clinical Rotation Curriculum?

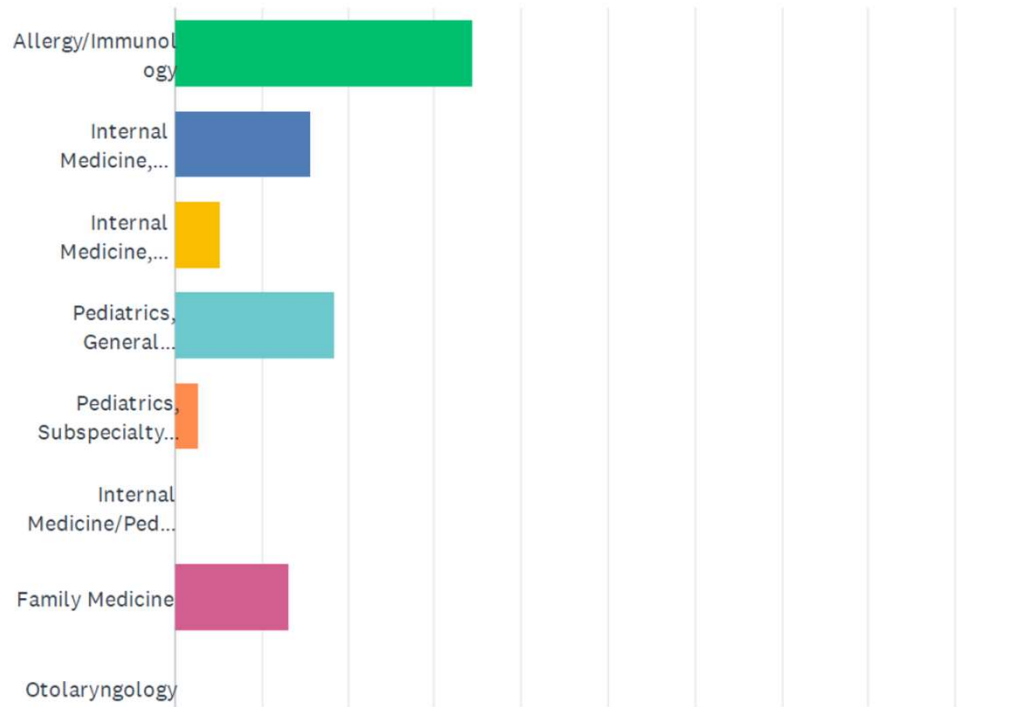

Answered: 38 Skipped: 14

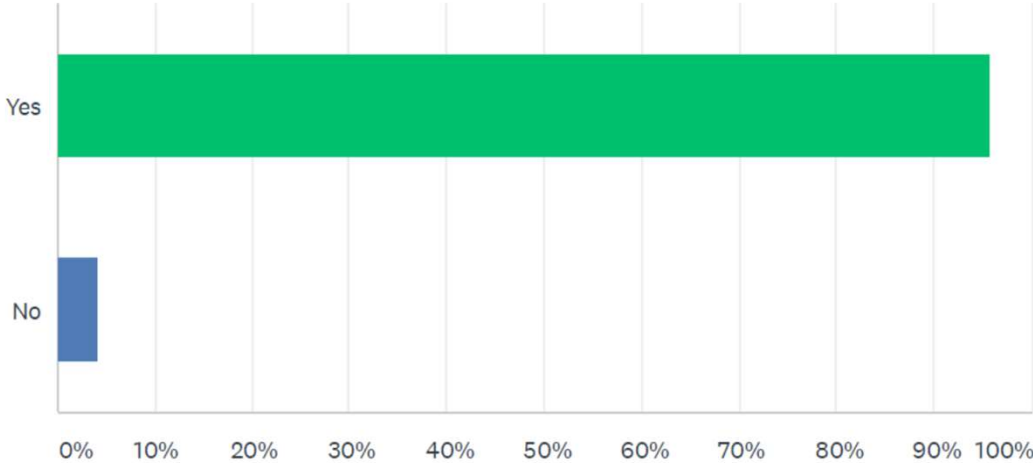
