OVERVIEW

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

This program has been developed by the Texas Allergy, Asthma and Immunology Society (TAAIS) for the practicing allergist/immunologist.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this activity, participants should be able to:

1. Manage chronic rhinosinusitis with nasal polyps and assess when (and if) such patients should be referred to the otolaryngologist for surgical options.
2. Describe morphologic features of several conditions that mimic atopic dermatitis.
3. Recognize the heterogeneity of mast cell activation syndromes and understand the rationale of applying the consensus diagnostic criteria.
4. Explain the anatomical approach to the evaluation of a patient with chronic cough.
5. Review the role of allergic and non-allergic rhinitis, and chronic rhinosinusitis in chronic cough.
6. Describe some of the common genetic techniques utilized in diagnosis and management of primary immunodeficiency and provide some guidelines for interpretation of variants identified by genetic testing.
7. Discuss the latest classification of mastocytosis and formulate treatment options for different disease categories.
8. Explain the USP 797 guidelines as they apply to Allergen Immunotherapy.
9. Identify good candidates for oral food challenges in the office based on clinical history, testing, and potential benefits of tolerating the food.
10. Describe the role played by the AMA working with other medical societies to advocate for physicians and their patients.
11. Discuss ways to successfully support legislative efforts that impact the practice of allergy, asthma, and immunology.
12. Explain and apply the clinical diagnostic criteria for acute FPIES.

TARGET AUDIENCE AND EDUCATIONAL METHODS

The target audience will be over 160 board-certified allergists/immunologists in Texas. Education will take place through didactic lectures, case presentations and question/answer sessions. There are no prerequisites.
